The School Expands. Our first Form 6 (Year 12) starts in July this year. We are one of the few schools in our area to offer senior schooling, the pathway to university. Katoke-Lweru Secondary School has more than 40 students entering Form 6 thanks to Australian sponsors, good resources, capable and caring staff and an environment that encourages learning.

A Leading School. This year's great results by Form 4 has our school ranking in the first 9% of the nation. With the return home of Sid and Marilyn Moir after an incredibly valuable six years, Rowena Bragg takes up the reins of leadership of the school with her husband Peter. The impetus of the school as a leading educational institution in NW Tanzania is continuing.

Building Program. More accommodation is a priority to meet the expanding number of staff and students. Last year a second boys' dormitory and classrooms were added. Construction of staff accommodation is urgently required to help attract suitable staff. We are most grateful for architect Geoff Deane's generous and skillful contribution to develop a Master Plan along with valuable expertise of our building team here in Sydney.

Volunteer Opportunities. A building supervisor, an administration/finance officer, plumber, teacher mentors, ESL teachers, sponsorship/publicity officer and other support staff are urgently needed. Poverty Relief. We continue to provide assistance to those experiencing critical health and poverty needs, for example, through the expansion of our malaria prevention program. The provision of subsidised insect treated nets to families has a proven record of reducing the incidence of malaria from around 70% to 10-15%.

Practical help. We love reaching our to people in need. And with your help, we're able to give people a hand when they need it the most. Take Dorisella, **a** cheerful and diligent house worker. She has five children aged from 3 to 17 but has been deserted by her husband and lives with her brother in a village, Kyam Pisi, 3 km from Katoke. On Friday she told me her 8 year old girl, Aulea, was sent home from school that week because she did not have school shoes. The old ones were finished and Dorisella could not afford to replace them. When Dorisella brought in the shoes we understood why; they were worn beyond repair by even the ingenious local repair man; soles were hanging off and one foot had nothing under the heel.




So we got a new pair in Bukoba that cost \$A9.50 equivalent to nearly three days of her wages. She can pay a portion but we will subsidise them. Poverty is hard on parents and children. Sometimes it's the little things that count the most.
